Aurora Trinity Craft Collective

Many of you kindly supported my request for sewing machines and have offered materials for the Trinity Centre Sewing Group. I am taking this opportunity to update you on the progress of the group, and hope to inspire you also to use your interests with others.

From a young age I have enjoyed sewing, and my career course was set on a textile degree, and a dream of developing craft co-operatives in 3rd world countries. Yes I was a child of the Live Aid era! However severe glandular fever disrupted my studies, this combined with my disillusionment of a progressive art foundation, caused a major change in career direction. Forward many years and a reduction in my work hours, I needed to find new ways to use my time. I realised, inspired by Space for You I could use my craft skills locally in group work. Jenny MacDowell gave me a contact for Helen, who already ran an Art group at the Trinity Centre and leads Made in Roath. We have now run the group together for 3 years, and Helen has taught me a lot in the process.

The Group is aimed at any individual interested in craft work in the local community. It aims to share skills relevant

to developing employment skills, and to be all inclusive, recognising that many come with craft skills we can all learn from. Many refugees and asylum seekers have attended the group, alongside a handful of individuals from the local community. In practice I have found it challenging learning to communicate with individuals with a limited grasp of English and any locals attending have also experienced this challenge. We encourage the group to chat and practice their English together, allowing them space to be, without having to explain their story. In time we have learnt some of their backgrounds, and see the effects of the government's unwritten policy of regularly moving on asylum seekers to discourage them to stay. It has been emotionally challenging to witness the distress of threats of deportation and sudden relocation, the anxiety of trafficked individuals and the isolation of single parents. Many come with children, who enjoy the space, the toys and their own crafts. We are increasingly recognising the mental health benefits of the group and plan a project to measure this more clearly. Initially the group focused

on screen printing and embroidery. A local GP heard of us through one of our members and requested we made 'wheaty' type lavender bags, to help her patients sleep and donated lavender towards this. We decorated the lavender bags with embroidered panels, allowing us to develop stitching skills. We spent some time ensuring everyone could use one of our 10 donated sewing machines, to set up and sew independently with them. Last year Helen got a grant for us to make a quilt to be displayed at the National Eisteddfod, we based this around the feelings of belonging and a sense of home. We visited St Fagans together, and learnt about the Welsh Quilts, many individuals contributed to form an almost stained-glass window effect result, which is now displayed in the Trinity Centre. We then did a project around textile patterns and printing, and the work was sold in Cardiff Museum.

Saturday community workshops and holiday activities are important to the group, culminating in a pop up shop this summer in the Queens arcade. Helen continues to gain funding for projects, next term we are learning about spinning and weaving, and there will be a spin off men's woodwork group. In the new year we hope to run a dress making course, which has been much requested by many of

the ladies.

The group is now called the Aurora Trinity Craft Collective, and we have formed a small charity. We still meet every Friday morning 10-12 at The Trinity Centre, attendance fluctuates between 4 -12 women, children and a small number of men. The group is purely led by volunteers and supporting the children and babies alongside teaching sewing skills and monitoring 'sewing sharps' is a constant challenge. We are looking to gain a rota of individuals happy to play with the children, if any of you are able and drawn to volunteer? I have found running the group has re-fired my interest in embroidery, and I have learnt many new skills from the group. The gentleness, determination and perseverance of many of the Mums attending is inspiring and challenging. We all have a capacity to roll with life's punches and take its ups and downs, but sharing them with others makes life much more rewarding.

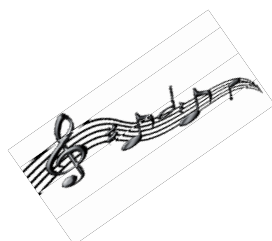

A few months ago, I wrote in Crossroads that if nothing changed with my job, my post would be made redundant at the end of August! The good news is that I am still employed and, following four separate lots of funding coming within four months (after a year with almost nothing), my post now seems secure for at least another year or so! I have never been so close to such a situation and, whilst I am sure I would have survived, it is such a relief to know that the work (which in my view is certainly needed) can continue.

My role with People & Work (a Welsh charity established in 1984 – www.peopleandwork.org.uk) is based mainly in Rhondda and involves tackling issues around education, employment and wellbeing. Those who connect with me on social media will know that one of our projects recycles unwanted sportswear and is developing into a social business – using the profits to fund sport and fitness activities in Rhondda (www.playitagainsport.wales). If anyone has unwanted sports kit or has contact with others who would like to donate to this cause, please feel free to contact me and I can collect items. We sometimes have new sportswear for sale, too! We sell out of a partner charity, Too Good To Waste (www.toogoodtowaste.co.uk).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have been so supportive of me during what has been a very challenging time: belonging to Beulah, being a member of Christ's body there is so important and reminds me that with God, no-one is redundant.
