confronted with the temptations to power and personal authority, he responded by trusting God. He already knew God as love greater than humans can imagine, as present throughout life. Jesus trusted what he knew of God and found his way through the wilderness to his next phase of life - for him a new ministry.

We too have spent years learning about God's identity. We know God, as revealed in Jesus. Our God seeks to create a broad community with varied people, a community where love is the guide and justice is When we find practiced. ourselves in a 'wilderness of waiting,' we know God is with us. We are not alone. When the waiting feels too much, love comes to us. Love comes through the care of old friends, through the concern of people dealing with our care, through the people who are with us.

Of course, the 'wilderness of waiting' seems like it lasts forever - forty days and forty nights, or forty years. Yet we know that at the end of our Lenten journey, there is Easter - a day of surprises. Whether in the garden or at the empty tomb, Jesus is present. The first

visitors to the garden found they were not alone. Either they were together, they found a risen Jesus, or they encountered a stranger with a message of hope. The companionship and hope of Easter are promises to which we can cling when the waiting seems so very long.

Maybe our forty days and nights are only the journey of Lent. Maybe they are something more challenging which we are facing. Whether Lenten challenges, or life challenges, we offer you these blessings:

May you find good companions. May you feel God's presence. May your Lenten forty days and nights be full of love. May your encounters during Lent call you further toward being workers for justice and peace in Jesus' name.

And may Easter remind you, that God surprises us with hope - even during the longest days and nights. May the Resurrection bring you with the warmth of companions - who share love freely and bring you joyful surprises.

Climate Protest in London from 21st April

Christian Climate Action. Extinction Rebellion and other climate groups are inviting all who care about our planet to be part of a Parliament protest in Square, Westminster, call on the UK government to take more action on its environmental commitments. They aim to harness people power by building relationships of inclusion and cooperation.

They say: "Gathering at the Houses of Parliament day after day in large numbers means we can leave the locks, glue and paint behind and instead demonstrate faith in a critical mass of people to create a moment that's impossible to ignore. The invitation is to all humans, all movements, all organisations to come together and stay for as long as you can."



Ways to join in:

- Travel to London for a day, e.g. Friday 21st or Saturday 22nd April.
- Find out if others in your area are going and travel with them.
- Eileen is going to London on Friday 21st: please let me know if you're planning to take part it'd be great if we could travel as a group.
- Organise a special church service or local gathering if it's too far to go to Westminster.
- Share news of the event with others.
