Letter from the Manse

the radical Hebrew understanding of the need to care for the sojourner, the traveler, the other passing through another's space and place. The citizens of Sodom are portrayed as doing the opposite: seekina to assassinate the sojournthe travellers, the ers, others.

Cult prostitution is condemned in the Bible – and these are references to same sex relationships however, these texts do not refer to loving relationships. Instead, they are in keeping with the drive for prohibiting iustice. the exploitation sexual of others. Homosexuality, as we know it now, simply was not a topic of the Bible.

As referenced above, in Isaiah 56 God welcomes the faithful eunuch and foreigner to God's house. This passage is the closest text we have to indicate God's intention for those whose sexuality might align to what we would today identify as a LGBTQIA+ person. It is very clear from this passage that sexuality, gender and nationality are not bars from being welcomed in God's community.

Jesus himself spends his recorded ministry reaching outside the traditional boundaries of the religious community. He interacts with women, with tax collectors, with foreigners,

those who were with disabled and ill. He does people challenge to change, but he never challenges people to change the fundamental aspects of who they are not ethnicity or gender. The rich young ruler went away sad because he wasn't ready to give away his money, not because he was asked to change himself physically - only spiritually.



The events of the last couple of weeks remind us there is still prejudice against people in the LGBTQIA+ community. They experience exclusion and violence regularly. Graffiti Jesus is one way Beulah communicates God's loving presence. We are sad some have hurt God's been by message of welcome and inclusion, but there are others who have been touched and inspired by the message.

To the community of Beulah, thank you for taking this journey and being a place of openness and spiritual exploration for all people - without question.

If you feel differently, we can have a conversation with you, but we are following God's ways. We may make mistakes. but our understand of God's inclusive love is not a mistake. To all those, and their families, in the LGBTQIA+ community, we see you. We lament the continued physical, spiritual, and emotional violence perpetuated upon you. We see you, and we stand with you.

To Jesus, when we fail to stand with those on the margins of society, we are sorry. We are grateful for the guidance you give us to live in love and take risks. Give us the energy to keep on the path you lay before us, embodying your love.



However, of concern to us all was the fact that the Concert numbers are still not up to where they were before the pandemic struck (100 approx. per concert now 70 approx.) and we are now running the Concerts at a loss.

(I again want to thank Cathryn Hales for her generosity in seed funding the start of the series in 2008.)

As a result of our meeting it was decided with great reluctance to:

• put up the entrance fee for the Concerts, raising it from its current £5 to £8. We hope that this will solve the financial problem without losing too many audience members. Students can still attend for £5.

Dear friends at Beulah,

Watching Cardiff Singer of the World this past week has been not only a treat, but very nostalgic.

Memories of attending the finals night sitting round big round tables with Beulah friends at Cardiff Castle have flooded over me this whole week. I can't remember whether I joined in two or three times, but wow! such fun!

So, I thought I would drop Crossroads a line, to tell you all what I am up to these days.

After my husband Tom died in 2005, I moved from Barry to Thurso in the very north of Scotland and served at Thurso URC for four eventful years. Then, in 2009, I moved to Richmond, West London where I looked after two churches; Richmond URC, and Raleigh Road United Church (united with the Methodists).

In 2013, I got married again, to Andreas Wittenstein who was mv classmate at Atlantic College. We went to Spain for our honeymoon, and ended up buying a 27-acre finca in an area known as Las Alpujarras about an hour's drive south of Granada. We moved here in September 2015 and have now qualified for permanent residency in Spain. Our marriage didn't work out, but we are great friends. Andreas



still lives in Finca Belluga up on the hill and I live down below in the middle of our village.

Most of my neighbours are traditional Spanish farmers who leave vegetables and eggs on my porch and laugh at my struggles with their local dialect. Other neighbours are English, Scottish, German, Swiss, and Dutch; all good friends. This part of Spain is full of writers, musicians and artists.

Our local town Órgiva has twelve choirs, one of which has become the hub of my social life. On Sundays, I host a small group of Quakers. My sister spends a lot of time in a lovely coastal town an hour's drive from here, so we see a lot of each other. Life is good!

The renovation of my house will be complete in September. Do get in touch if you would like a peaceful week or two in a quirky paradise (except for July & August when it's more like the fires of the other place!)
