at climate crisis events was in vain. She needed a glimpse of the hope in the resurrection even more that year than on previous Easters. She didn't hear it.

Perhaps she needed to hear that God is present in our tragic and traumatic events. While God doesn't stop any of them from happening, through Christ our pain is known and can be healed. God is in the midst of our lives. God does not abandon us to our own crosses. The resurrection is a powerful reminder that love overcomes the sin and brokenness of the world.

Maybe she needed a reminder that her work was important, even if she couldn't see the 'results.' The message of the resurr-ection was a reminder that God was working through her.

Resurrection hope could give her the drive to continue her work in the name of Christ.

We don't know what message you need to hear this Easter. Maybe it is simply this:

'This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed. . . God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again.' John 3.16,17 *The Message* 

We hope the love expressed in Easter is a glimmer of hope for you.



On Sunday 27th April the Eco Group is leading worship, and we have invited Anne Hatton from Ripple Effect to join us in the service to talk about how community garden twinning can help families in Africa with three years training in sustainable organic farming.

Starting with small kitchen gardens, they can grow enough to eat, set up small

businesses and send their children to school.

Anne will be bringing resources with her and will join us for coffee after worship and the Community Meal, so you will have a chance to speak to her personally and find out more. You may want to twin your own garden!



## Gerardo's Visit

Gerardo Tobar Guatemala visited Beulah on 10th March and the Whittaker Lounge packed with people ready to welcome him to the church and to Cardiff. Alongside Beulah members, there were folk from Llanfair Uniting in Penrhys and Van Road URC in Caerphilly, as well as representatives from other churches and organisations.

Gerardo is a Christian Aid Programme Manager in Guatemala – the focus of this year's Christian Aid Week. Guatemala has unpredictable rain patterns which bring both severe droughts and catastrophic floods. We heard how the climate crisis is intensifying the seasons, causing crops

to fail and plunging farming families into hunger and poverty.

Gerardo told us of Aurelia, an inspirational farmer and community leader. Many of the vital crops that she depends on are withering before her eyes. Aurelia says, "Climate change has been killing our crops, and this is our food."

Christian Aid and its partners work alongside indigenous communities to support them in diversifying their farming practices, building water recycling systems, selling their produce locally and campaigning for land rights.

Hearing at firsthand from Gerardo the stories of real people and their struggles and hopes was fascinating and inspiring. 2025 is Christian Aid's 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Please keep a look out for the fundraising and campaigning we'll be doing in Beulah over the coming months.

"Thank You" to everyone who was involved in the Fire Drills that were recently carried out in the Canolfan & the Church, there hasn't been one for a while & the observations made will help to improve Beulah's Fire Procedures going forward. apologies for My interruption to the Sunday Services & to anyone who felt inconvenienced, but the weather was favourable. albeit chilly on both occasions & it was a necessary, worthwhile exercise.

A pair of 'Dorguard' fire door retainers have been fitted to

the fire doors between the two ground floor foyer areas in the Canolfan, primarily to improve wheelchair access to the lift, which has occasionally proved problematic in the past.

They allow the fire doors to be held open, but will close normally if the fire alarm bells continually sound & won't compromise the fire safety of the building. I'd appreciate any comments regarding them.
