Reverend Ken Graham:

Celebrating 60 years of Ministry

July 13, 2025

This summer will mark the 60th anniversary of the ordination of Ken Graham into church ministry. Ken was the minister at Beulah from 1980-2002, and following his retirement, he and Liz became members at City URC. To recognise this



occasion, there will be a joint service with City in Beulah on July 13, and a buffet lunch in Canolfan afterwards. We hope that as many people as possible will be able to join with Ken and Liz to enjoy a wonderful celebration on such a special day.

There will be a sign-up sheet in the porch nearer the time, and we will be appealing for help on the day with catering, setting up and clearing away.

You're never too old to ride a bike – or a trike!

This month we celebrated Vera's Dad's 94th birth-day.

We hired a side-byside tricycle from Pedal Power in Pontcanna Fields. Pat and Michael rode gently round the park for about an hour. accompanied by Vera on her own bike. Michael could pedal if he wanted to, or not. We stopped by the river to enjoy the sun and the views.

It was a great way of extending the range we could go with Michael, compared with walking or using a wheelchair. The staff made sure he was comfortable on the bike - it's very adjustable and the seats have cushions, a supportive back, and arm rests too.

Afterwards we had homemade soup in the Pedal Power cafe, and of course cake.

It was such a success, we'll be thinking of repeating it. It also got us thinking, who at Beulah might enjoy this? Pedal Power have quite a few side-by-sides, and you can easily hire ordinary bikes too, so a small group ride would be very possible. There is parking on site, though it's quite limited, so if we did take a group, car



sharing would be a good idea.

Pedal Power is open 6 days a week (not Mondays) from 10am to 5pm. Pat Ruddock volunteers there, so knows the ropes, and would be happy to explain more.

Gold Award

As most of you will know by now, Beulah was awarded A Rocha's Eco Church Gold Award at the beginning of May. The award scheme is a framework which enables churches to care for creation through practical action and helps congregations to 'go green' in all areas of church life.

We submitted our completed survey at the end of January, along with extensive evidence of our environmental activities as a congregation over many years. Then on 28th April Delyth Higgins, Eco Church Officer for Wales, and Julia Edwards, Church in Wales Climate Champion, visited Beulah as our assessors. They carried out a walk-through of the buildings and garden and then Martha, David, Ian, Marianne and I sat down with them for а conversation.

You are all part of Beulah's continued Eco Church journey, and I thought you would like to read how our assessors began their feedback ...

We are impressed by the breadth of your action and commitment across all the categories of the programme, and you provided us with a wealth of information and details about activities etc. As soon as you step into the church. vou realise that environmental issues and the joy of creation are at the fore of worship and teaching and underpin the very identity of Beulah. The church oozes environmentalism.

We will order our new Eco Church plaque and hopefully find an opportunity for a celebratory photograph!

Elders Nominations 2025

It's that time of year again when we consider our Eldership. We give thanks to those who will be finishing this Summer - for all their service and care for Beulah and our wider community. We thank Andrew Glanfield. Ian McDowell, Jenny McDowell, Eileen Newington who have served as our Church-Life Elders and Liz Kidd who has served as Chair of Elders and Church Meeting. We also thank Barbara Rhys who has served as Church Treasurer for many years.

We are therefore looking for Pastoral Elders and Church-Life Elders to start this Autumn.



As in previous years, our process starts with nominations by members of the congregation. All members of Beulah, both those who have not been an Elder before, and those who have previously served, are eligible for nomination. The nominations process will begin on Sunday 25 May and will run for 3 weeks until Sunday 15 June.

We will have a nominations box in the porch and nominations can also be submitted by email to <u>secretary@beulahurc.org.uk</u> or popped through the Church letterbox in a sealed envelope marked 'Nominations'. Nomination forms will be sent out by email with the notices each week during the 3 nomination weeks and will also be available by the nominations box in the porch.

Importantly, our process only works if people make nominations. You can nominate someone for any, or all of the roles, so please do think about who we might ask to serve in those roles and make a nomination.

Please note that we have reduced the Pastoral Elders' districts by two, so we are looking to fill three vacancies for Pastoral Elders.

If you have any questions about the nominations process or how to make a nomination, please speak to Anne James who is looking after the process for us this year.
